Greetings from ISTE Kerala Section!

I am using this opportunity to congratulate the management, staff and students of Mar Baselios College of Engineering and Technology, Thiruvananthapuram and Govt. Engineering College, Kozhikkode for the successful conduct of the Annual Faculty Convention and Student Convention of Kerala Section 2020-2021.

Like the previous year, Covid 19 pandemic is going to affect the regular academic sessions this year also. One of the most oft-used terms after the pandemic is the term "new normal." The new normal in education is the increased use of online learning tools. Online learning is now applicable not just to academics, but it also extends to extra-curricular activities for students as well.

Major casualty of the present system of learning is the difficulty in conducting practical/workshop sessions, without these, the knowledge students gain remains merely theoretical in nature, making it difficult for them to apply it in real life at a later stage. One option is to have virtual labs which provides facility for modelling of physical environment and carrying out simulations to yield result of experiments, providing an approximate version of the real-life experiment. Unfortunately, our institutes are ill-equipped, and students are not getting enough opportunities to get exposed to the equipment/instruments, even in virtual mode. Another casualty is the minimal physical interactions between students and teachers in an online class resulting in a sense of isolation for the students. Students learn a lot from being in the company of their peers.

ISTE chapters are advised to take initiatives for organising programmes/interactive sessions utilising the virtual resources available under the NMEICT (National Mission on Education through Information and Communication Technology) platform, facilitating communication between the students, peers, and teachers to overcome the limitations of online education. Virtual Labs can be made more effective and realistic by providing additional inputs like accompanying audio and video streaming of an actual lab experiment and equipment.

The 31st Annual Faculty Convention of ISTE Kerala Section was inaugurated by Shri. Arif Mohammad Khan, Hon'ble Governor of Kerala on 23rd January 2021 at Mar Baselios College of Engineering and Technology, Trivandrum. The theme of the convention was *"Challenges and opportunities in Technical Education in the post COVID Scenario"*. The inaugural function was presided by Dr. K. Vijayakumar, Chairman, ISTE Kerala Section. Dr. Abraham T. Mathew, Principal, MBCET welcomed the gathering. Dr. Nidhi M. B., Convenor of the ISTE Convention and ISTE National Executive Council Member, briefed about the convention.

In his inaugural speech, Shri. Arif Mohammed Khan spoke on the importance of National Education Policy and programmes such as ISTE convention to update and upskill faculty and thereby impart employability skills to the students. 
